
Review

Goodheart's work has flourished around the world within the chiropractic, dental, kinesiology, massage, acupuncture, and osteopathic professions. This exciting new text from Dr Kirdoglo is one of the most detailed attempts at explaining the anatomy, physiology and pathophysiology and treatment modalities of AK ever published in Europe.
