Phillip's academic career has covered the full range of responsibilities, from lesson planning & delivery to competency-based assessment, and to whole-of-program curriculum design and delivery.

He is driven by continuous quality improvement to strengthen delivery and enhance graduate outcomes and now favours Capability Outcomes over Competencies.

As a person he is a citizen of Asia but a resident of Australia and works effortlessly with passion across all borders including language and colour.

His pre-Chiropractic career was Commercial Broadcasting Management, largely radio stations but including a magazine and a television station. After recovering radio station 8HA from borderline insolvency he established a new commercial radio station in Invercargill New Zealand (4XF) and then another in Esperance Western Australia (6SE).

Phillip commenced his Chiropractic studies in 1985 at the Philip Institute of Technology Melbourne, graduating and first registering in November 1989.

His academic career began in January 1990 at Philip Institute which became RMIT University. Beyond becoming Head of the Discipline he was active in the management and implementation of new Chiropractic programs in Tokyo, Seoul, and Kuala Lumpur, and then in Australia at Central Queensland University (2011). He was appointed President of the Tokyo College of Chiropractic in 2018.

Phillip now donates his time and expertise to curate the curriculum of emerging programs in The Philippines, India, and Africa.

Currently he is the Founder and Editor of the Asia-Pacific Chiropractic Journal, and Director of Chiropractic Education and Research with Chiropractic India.
